## Our Mission

Invest to Elect (ITE) brings women to the political table as donors and activists to elect Democrats who support reproductive freedom to federal office.

Invest To Elect Illinois achieves this by:

- Planning and hosting events in support of U.S. Senate and House candidates and select organizations that engage voters in battleground states.
- Providing a community of like-minded women and a launchpad for members' civic engagement.

## How It Works

- Each calendar year, ITE members commit to invest a minimum of \$3,000 to ITE-vetted candidates and organizations.
- We organize and host private events for our contributors. Events are generally in person on weekdays and at lunchtime, providing members with the opportunity to interact with candidates in small group settings. Some events may be hosted over Zoom.
- Members' investments go directly to our events via specifically designated links for ITE contributions, or by check made out to the candidate/organization.
- Events typically cost \$1,000 to attend. Once a member has met her \$3,000 annual commitment, events cost \$500 to attend.
- Members may bring guests to events for \$250 (or young guests for \$100).
- Members pay dues of \$150 per year to support operating costs.

## Investment Strategy

Our Investment Strategy Committee identifies and researches candidates and voter engagement organizations that align with ITE's mission for recommendation to the Steering Committee. Once events are scheduled, each ITE member is invited to select which of those candidates or organizations she would like to support. Our four-pronged investment strategy is to invest in selected:

- 1 Vulnerable Democratic incumbent U.S. Senators;
- 2 U.S. Senate candidates running for open, winnable seats or vulnerable GOP held seats;
- 3 U.S. House candidates in contested races, primarily in Illinois;
- 4 Organizations in battleground states that engage voters
